



# House Day 2017

Non-live events must be handed in to the allocated teacher no later than Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February. These will be judged and results given out at the end of House Day.

Live events will take place on the morning of Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> February, judged live and results given out at the end of the day.

Every entry will receive 2 points for their house.

You must hand in or compete in at least one event, but you can do as many as you wish.

**The more you do the more points for your house.**

All totals will be added together and the winners will receive the House Day Cup.

**Every form must take part in the form event.**

Score are:

1<sup>st</sup> place: 10 points

2<sup>nd</sup> place: 7 points

3<sup>rd</sup> place: 5 points

## FORM EVENT

### House Day Language Activity.

Each form group is invited to assemble a display of "European things".

It can be for one, or several countries. You can include flags, postcards, maps, newspapers, traditional clothing such as berets, ornaments or maybe even traditional food. Please do not bring jewellery, coins or money.

Gather all your materials together and bring them on the day to the conference room and assemble them on a table to be photographed.

House captains will be responsible for assembling each display.

Items are to be collected at the beginning of lunchtime after judging.

## LIVE EVENTS

### Singing- Mr Langley and Mrs Sadler

Perform a song with/without a backing track for no longer than 2 minutes. Solo, duets or group (Melody/Harmony) and any genre. Judged on 'Performance & Entertainment Value'

Microphones/ amplification/access to CD/Mp3 players will be provided

### Instrumental Piece- Miss Thompson

Perform any piece of music from classical to rock to pop, no longer than 2 minutes. Solo, duets or groups.

### Egwin's got Talent!- Miss Quinn and Mr Pullan

Are you a magician? Can you juggle, dance or tumble?

If you have a talent that you want to share with the school (not singing or instrumental) then join in the live performance.

### Advert- Mrs Kennedy

Make a 30s-1 min advert about an existing product that is currently around. You must video and edit it on an iPad. The theme can be anything but it must sell the product in some way. It will be shown on the day to the audience. (Product must be agreed on before-hand.)

### Inspirational presentation- Mr Pullan

Present a 1-3 minute presentation about someone who inspires you. This maybe a friend or family member, a sports person, a musician or dare I say...a teacher! You can use computers to help or you can just talk, it's your choice. Prompt cards are allowed. This is good practice for youy speeches later in the year.

## **NON-LIVE EVENTS     Due in Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February**

### Food and Nutrition- Miss Davis

Design and make a sculpture using fruit and vegetables. You can choose a subject of your choice, animal or person. For a sheet of specifics please see Miss Davis.

### Hair Style Glamour- Mrs Gordon

You have to design and do a hairstyle on someone. It can be any style and items can be added to the hair. It can be a boy or girl hairstyle, but must be done on someone's hair. Pics or a video must be taken to show that you are the one doing it. No haircuts included. The more inventive the better!

### Geography House Day Challenge- Mr Jordan

Your house is named after a precious stone.

I want to know all about that stone - your house name!

On 2 sides of A4, maximum, produce an information sheet that includes:

Where you are found? Which countries? How you are made?

How you are collected? (mined) What uses do you have other than jewellery? How much of you is left in the world?

Other interesting facts about your place in the world - culture, religion

### Photography- Mrs Hoskins

Take a photo of something that best symbolises your house. Whether it be a colour or a shape or an object- anything!. It must be printed out and the use of Photoshop is allowed. Good luck!

### Upcycling Dress- Mrs Croft

Design a dress or outfit using recycled materials, including a swatch of material. It can be of any design/material. Be inventive! See Mrs Croft for a pro-forma sheet. Must be handed in by Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February.

### Inter-house Egg Competition- Miss Tyler

Hard boil eggs and decorate! It's that simple. You may have a setting/theme or background and you may use more than 1 egg. No teams allowed, 1 entry per person. For more info and ideas, there is a Powerpoint at:

### House Day Research Report Task- Mr Plane

Find out as much information about a **HORRIBLE** person from history, his/her times and his/her achievements. They must have been or done something significant.

The best entries will have important and interesting facts that are presented in a clear way with appropriate illustrations.

Also, include your opinion on what you think of them.

### The Great ST Egwins Bake-off!- Mrs Sadler and Mr Langley

Make and decorate 6 biscuits. You must follow the basic recipe provided by Mrs Sadler, but can add anything extra that you want. There must be 6 identical biscuits and they must be decorated in something connected to your house. Either design or colour.

### Funny, funny, ha, ha- Mr Clabbon

This competition will be a joke! Literally.

Jokes should be submitted in written form.

Winners will be the funniest (obviously) - but the literacy must be perfect.

### Computer Game Design - Mrs Higgins

Reckon you've got a brilliant game idea up your sleeve?

Spend hours lost in the world of your imagination?

Love to draw or are simply brimming with story ideas?

Then this House Day Challenge is for you!

To enter, you submit your own original game idea created by yourself on an application form from Mrs Higgins. If your game idea is brilliant then it will be entered into the BAFTA Young Game Designer Awards and if chosen as a winner, you'll get to meet top gaming experts who'll work with you to bring your game to life as you've never seen it before!

### Design a Hover Car- Mrs Coates

You must produce a 3D image of your car on A4 or A3 paper

You must colour your design in

You must annotate (explain your idea)

Explain how it hovers, what special features does it have. How does the hover car move along.

### Write a letter applying for your dream job- Mrs Cropper

If you could choose any career you wanted, what would it be?

Explain why it's your dream job and why you would be the right person to do it. Your letters can be handwritten or word-processed. Max word limit 500 words. Pictures can also be used.

### Amazing sporting facts quiz- Mr Taylor

In the week leading to the House Day, a sporting quiz will be held at one lunch time. Groups of no more than 3 are allowed, but you must all be in the same House. (2 points to the House per person, not group.) More info will follow.

### Sumdog Challenge- Mr Wood

Pupils can take part in a special Sumdog challenge that will be set up from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> until the Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February. Any pupil that takes part will get 2 points but the overall averages will be the scores taken for the overall winners.

### The Horror Challenge!- Mrs Petit

Write the start of a horror story in under 300 words. Make sure you grab my attention, scare me senseless and leave me unable to sleep at night!

### Maths from Around the World- Mrs Payne

Answer some fascinating maths facts and questions about the world we live in. There will be a range of questions from easy to hard. Must be handed in by Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February.
