

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

- 1. The name of the school is **ST EGWIN'S CE MIDDLE SCHOOL**
- 2. The school is a **Voluntary Controlled** school.
- The name of the governing body is "The governing body of St Egwin's CE Middle School"
- 4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. Three parent Governors
 - b. One LA Governor
 - c. One staff Governor
 - d. One headteacher
 - e. Two foundation Governors
 - f. Two co-opted Governors
- 5. Total number of Governors 10
- 6. The **Board of Education of the Diocese of Worcester** shall appoint **one** Foundation Governor.
- 7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a Foundation Governor ex officio:

The Principal Officiating Minister of Evesham All Saints w. St Lawrence

- (b) The Archdeacon of Worcester shall be entitled to appoint a Foundation Governor to act in the place of the ex officio Foundation Governor whose governorship derives from the office named above, in the event that that ex officio Foundation Governor is unable or unwilling to act as a Foundation Governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations.
- 8. **The Archdeacon of Worcester** is entitled to request the removal of any ex officio Foundation Governor and to appoint any substitute Governor.



9. Ethos Statement:

Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.
